Limited financial support from the National Science Foundation

(<http://www.nsf.gov>) is available to student attendees from US academic institutions to defray travel expenses. Awards of funding to students will be based on active research in mesh generation or interest in meshing as a future research topic. Up to \$700 of the travel expense is reimbursed to a student who is awarded. However, due to the limited funding, the amount may be less depending on the number of recipients. The priority is given to the students who present a paper in the conference or present a poster in the poster session.

A student who is willing to receive the financial support needs to submit the following documents.

- (1) One page statement of interest signed by your advisor or chairman of your department describing your interest in meshing research, how the meshing roundtable conference helps your research, and what you benefit from attending the conference. If you are presenting a paper, include the title of the paper in the statement. If you are presenting a poster, include a brief description of the research you present in the poster.
- (2) A copy of the student ID.
- (3) Original copy of the receipt showing the travel expense.
